
What are Reproductive Health Indicators?

Reproductive health indicators summarize data which are collected to answer questions that are relevant to planning and management of RH programmes.

How useful are they?

The indicators provide a useful tool to assess needs, and monitor and evaluate programme implementation and impact. The indicators are expressed in rates proportions, averages or in absolute numbers.

A Conceptual Framework for Monitoring and Evaluating Reproductive Health Programme Components



Organizational Resources and Policies

The inputs needed to meet the desired results are resources and the policy environment.

Implementation

It is the process through which the desired interventions are carried out to achieve the expected outputs.

Service Outputs and Utilization

If the programme activities are implemented as desired, then the results of such activities should meet the programme objectives.

Impact

If the programme objectives are met, then there will be an impact at the population level.

The selection of right activities under Processes is extremely important to have an effect on outputs and impact. Activities that have close relationship with outputs are likely to have a greater impact. Activities are generally determined based on theory and experience.

Indicators (an illustrative list)

1. Input Indicators:

- Percentage of trained staff in the delivery of FP services.
- Percentage of available contraceptive commodities to the total estimated demand.
- Percentage of funds available for IEC and Advocacy activities to the total family planning budget.
- A policy document on family planning in place

2. Process Indicators:

- Number of clinics providing FP services during a given period.
- Percentage of contraceptive services provided to the estimated total demand.
- Percentage of utilization of funds to the total allocated during a given period.
- Policy document translated into an action plan
- Percentage of IEC material distributed to the total number produced.


3. Output Indicators:

- New Acceptor rate of different FP methods
- Contraceptive prevalence rate of different methods
- Knowledge levels of different FP methods

4. Impact Indicators:

Percentage decline in fertility
